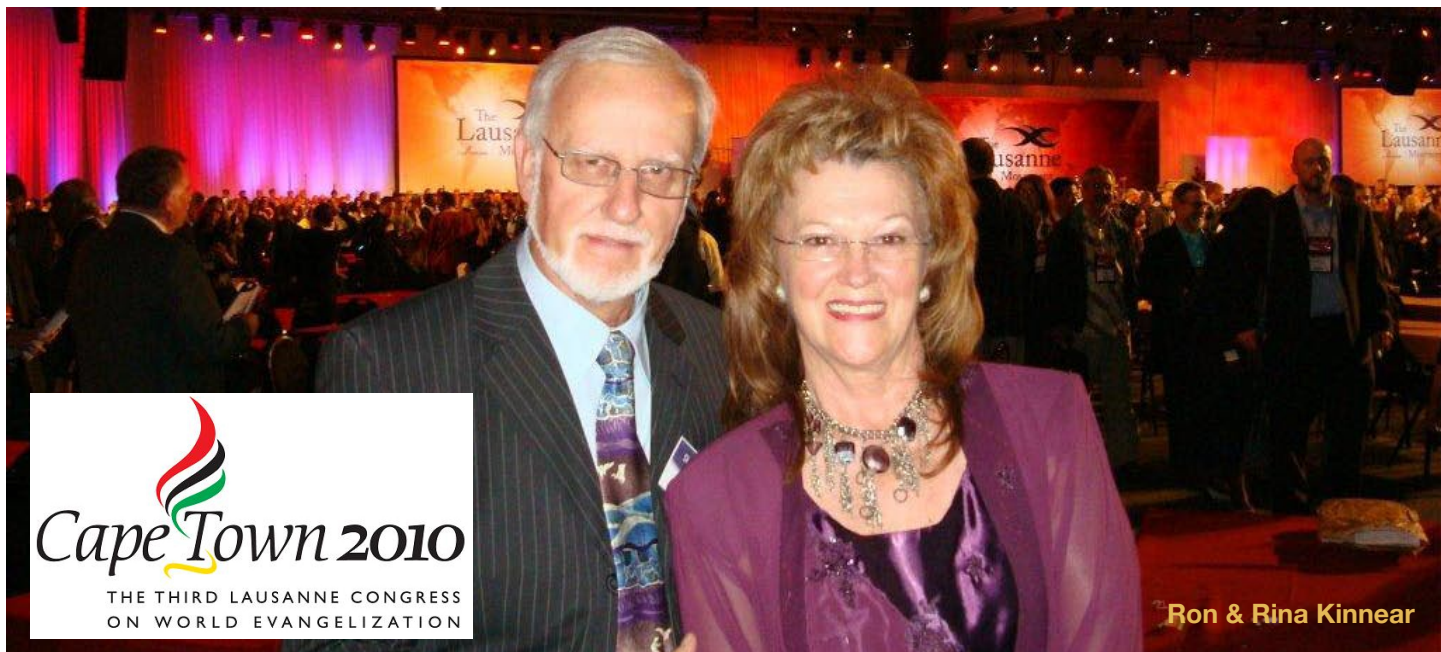

World Leaders Plan Evangelism Strategies

Lausanne Conference in S.A.

Several once-in-a-lifetime events took place in South Africa this year. Firstly, South Africa hosted the **Soccer World Cup** which is the world's largest sporting event. And secondly, **South Africa hosted the Lausanne Conference which attracted delegates from 197 countries with an attendance of over 4000 Christian leaders.** We had the opportunity of being at both!



It was the latter that thrilled us most. We firstly attended the overflow conference where we together with 600 other venues around the globe were given updates on the conference. Because of our location being in close proximity to the **Lausanne Conference**, several of their key-note speakers also addressed us. Then the miracle happened. **Rina and I had the opportunity of attending the Lausanne Conference.**

Being there, interacting with world leaders and discussing strategy with delegates from French-speaking Africa was an awesome experience.

The highlight was the closing communion service presented in a "Kenyan Tradition." It was an unforgettable experience.

The Lausanne Conference produced the **Cape Town Covenant** which no doubt will be discussed around the world. The emphasis was on Evangelism. Not surprising seeing that **the first conference was initiated by Evangelist Billy Graham.** The challenge the Church is facing, amongst many others, is that **2.7 billion people have never heard of the Saving Grace of our Lord and Saviour.** We trust that this conference will ignite a fire in the Church across the globe. We will certainly do our part. **By His grace we will SPREAD THE FIRE.**

“Something Extra” Exceeds Goals! 20,000 Soul Winning Project



We declared 2010 our “Year of Celebration”. To date we trained **1054 pastors and church leaders in Uganda, Rwanda and Burundi in personal evangelism.** Pastors have submitted progress reports during our celebrations on how many souls were birthed into the Kingdom. **The official figure now stands at 20,929!**

The Burundi coordinator has sent out a research team to find out how many souls have been won in that country during the past 6 months. Also, our Land Rover let us down, and consequently, we will only be able to visit Uganda next year to conduct celebrations. This will greatly increase this figure.

During our recent visit three Evangelism Explosion (EE3) clinics were presented. We praise the Lord that a new country was included for a clinic, the Democratic Rep. of the Congo (DRC). Previous attempts were frustrated due to war and unrest.

The enemy again wanted to frustrate our plans. When we arrived at the border between Rwanda and the DRC, we were expected to pay \$250 each for a visa. All the pastors of the DRC instead crossed the border and came to where we were! 53 pastors and church leaders attended the clinic. They were greatly motivated and left greatly enthused to win souls for the Lord. One of the Bishops is trusting the Lord for a harvest of 4000 souls before the end of December.

We plan to be back to conduct another EE3 clinic in Goma, have a celebration for the souls won and have a conference with several churches participating in May 2011.

Two pastors came with us—**Willie van Zyl** of Port Shepstone and **Cobus Scheepers** of Wilro Park—and were a great blessing. They taught the students, senior pastors and also spoke at the Student Banquet and Bible College graduation. Everybody fell in love with them and asked them to come back again.

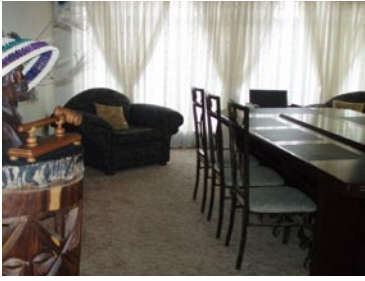


The Lord Now Owns The Kigali Bible College Campus!
