## Our Mozambique & Malawi Neighbors Need Help!

Cyclone Idai hit Mozambique and Malawi with a heard blow on March 15 causing severe flooding! This terrible tropical storm has blown over these beautiful beaches and displaced 600,00 of our neighbors providing a breeding ground for despair, disease, and great need.

Africa Missions is leading the charge to help the churches and believers in these flood damaged areas. I received a call

from the President of the AFM of SA **Pastor George Mahlobo** requesting Africa Missions to head up the AFM relief effort in Mozambique. The Lord had already prepared our hearts for his call and we were ready to respond without hesitation.

Africa Missions also helped to bring relief to Mozambique in 2000, when the Limpopo River flooded causing loss of life and severe damage to property. We were able to assist by sending food (especially full cream powdered milk for babies), blankets, etc. We also helped to re-roof 34 homes in the Limpopo Province working through Pastor Moses Shipalana, who we are working with this time, too.

### Our plan of action is:

1. To call for **donations to help roof homes**. This is a more permanent solution to provide immediate shelter to families.
2. To raise **funds for food supplies** and transportation to get the supplies to Mozambique. Maize donations from farmers, cash donations for milk powder etc. will be especially welcome.
3. To receive clothing, blankets and **anything that will help families to set up their homes**. These are much needed. Please refer to the attached *Guide Sheet For Donations of Clothing, Food and House Hold Items*. Africa Missions has a depot where goods can be sent to and processed for shipping to Mozambique..

### The Good Samaritan Helped His Neighbor

The Good Samaritan saw the need and decided to help without any hesitation or reservation. Perhaps he found himself in a similar situation and saw how the priest and the Pharisee turned a blind eye as if he did not exit. ### *Guide Lines For Clothing and Food Donations*

We call on local churches and individuals in South Africa to donate food and clothing to address the need of thousands of people affected by the cyclone that devastated the city of Beira and other towns and cities in huge areas of Mozambique, Zimbabwe and Malawi.

#### **Depots to receive Clothing and Non-perishable food:**

**Before goods are dispatched It is essential that delivery arrangements be made. This will ensure that somebody will be at the depot to receive your goods.**

#### **Main Depot:**

#### **NEEDS**

**Clothing:** Please sort out the clothing and place clothing into black bags before it is delivered.

Each bag should be clearly marked with its contents; i.e., Ladies Clothes, Men's Clothes, Girls ages 8-9, etc. This will be of great assistance to us. All clothing should be clean before being placed into the bags.

**Food:** Any non-perishable foods will be welcome. High on the list are: Maize Meal, Full Cream Milk Powder (for infants) and tins of Beans (with can openers). However any canned foods will be welcome.

**Household Items:** As families have been left destitute they have to set up their homes from the start. Blankets, Cooking Utensils, Cleaning Supplies, Disinfectant Liquids; i.e., Dettol, Savlon, etc.

School Supplies: Pens, Pencils, Note Books, Bags, etc. will greatly assist learners to get started again.

**Volunteers:** We call upon churches in the greater Northern Pretoria area to send volunteers to assist with the receiving and dispatching of goods.
