Africa Missions was robbed on the field:

On May 15, our field representative Herman Hinsbeeck entered South Sudan for three weeks of training for pastors in that country. On Thursday, May 19, he was robbed of his and our cash, and his iPads, and passport with multiple-entry visa.

With the help of the South African Embassy in Juba, South Sudan, a special 24-hour emergency travel document was issued to him so that he and his companions could leave the country. We rejoice that Herman was not hurt; but all of the mission money was taken, so the trip had to be abandon. In short, the loss to Africa Missions nears the R150,000 mark (\$9,650). A small amount of that has been recouped through donations of churches and individuals in South Africa. However, the larger portion is still outstanding. If you could consider helping us with the great wound to our finances, we would certainly appreciate it. And please, keep us in prayer as we try to recoup our losses.
